Heath attracted a fair amount of national notoriety when Kissimmee, Fla., police arrested and charged the 24-year-old righthander with soliciting a prostitute during Braves' spring training camp. Heath allegedly responded to an online listing for prostitution and became ensnared in the police sting when he arrived at the apartment he had agreed upon with a police decoy. He spent a night in Osceola County jail before being released on a \$10,000 bond. The Braves suspended Heath before cutting ties completely.

The Cuban defector Bueno (29) played four seasons in the Braves system between AA-AAA. He made the MLB debut in 2008 pitching one game. His minor league track record is 12-10-1 3.90 ERA in 351.1 IP. When defected from Cuba, Bueno was considered a prospect with some aspirations to the National Team.

The Mariners, under previous scouting director Bob Fontaine, took a chance on the Louisiana Tech product, signing him for \$200,000 as what constituted a 14th-round gamble. But after racking up big strikeout numbers in his first two college seasons, Burnett turned in an atrocious junior year, going 0-4, 8.41 in eight starts (plus two relief appearances), with 30 strikeouts, 32 walks and eight home runs allowed in 41 innings. His tenure with the Mariners was not much better. In making 14 starts for short-season Everett last season, Burnett went 2-4, 4.66 with 7.1 strikeouts, 5.8 walks and 1.1 home runs allowed per nine innings. A performance that did not exactly qualify as a mark of distinction for a 22-year-old, second-year pro in the Northwest League.

At least not initially. Wilhelmsen recovered his 97 mph velocity and struck out 13 batters in 11 2/3 innings in the independent Golden League, prompting the Brewers to call him back for a tryout. He subsequently pinched a nerve in his shoulder, though, and drew his release from the Brewers in August. That's where this story picks up, with Mariners general manager Jack Zduriencik, who originally drafted Wilhelmsen as Brewers scouting director nearly eight years ago, helping to orchestrate his new contract with Seattle.
